Watson Retires After


29 Years Of Service

Twenty-nine years ago the vice president for academic affairs, Dr. Donald Watson, came to San Diego State College. The sound of construction, the problem of parking, the scarcity of available rooms on campus were characteristic of San Diego State in 1939 just as they are characteristic of today's campus. Dr. Watson came to help establish the physical science division. He is retiring this year.


Reflecting on his years at San Diego State, Dr. Watson noted some of the things he feels to be major accomplishments on the campus since he first came here. Among these were the improvement of entrance requirements, the increase of the number of major fields providing a richer and more rounded program, the addition of professional fields, the addition of the graduate program, and the expanding doctorate program. The most memorable event of his twenty-nine years, says Dr. Watson, was being able to speak to, and to introduce President Kennedy when he came to San Diego State in June of 1963. Looking into the future, Dr. Watson says, "San Diego State will become a multi-purpose

university comparable to Michigan State or Ohio State."

Research

Bob Hardy, biology graduate is conducting studies in genetics. He is looking for developmental evidence of genetics mutations in fruit fly sperm. To do this he studies thin slices of fruit fly under an electron microscope. He uses a glass knife to cut specimen slices that are so thin they are measured in wave lengths of light.

A carbon dioxide laser, constructed at SDS under the direction of Dr. John Bolte, is used in graduate studies by Jim Osmondsen, graduate in physics. He is aided by Jack Fergusen, a senior physics major. The development of the carbon dioxide laser is expected to solve problems in space communication.



Air Science

The Division of Aerospace Studies offers a two year upper division Air Force ROTC program. The curriculum is Force ROTC program. The curriculum is a generalized one and consists of courses designed to produce officers who have broad backgrounds as well as high growth potential. Flight training is offered as part of the AFROTC program to seniors in the pilot category. Upon the completion of the AFROTC program and requirements for a baccalaureate degree cadets are commissioned as second lieutenants in the Air Force and serve a tenants in the Air Force and serve a minimum of four years active duty.



Business Administration

The School of Business Administration is rapidly expanding and has a well organized program of undergraduate and graduate classes in business. It includes the departments of Accounting, Business Law and Finance, Management, Marketing and Business Education. The school has grown from an enrollment of 1,507 in 1962 to 2,135 in spring 1967. The school prepares students to enter areas in business ranging from the dynamic computer game to secretarial management, marketing and finance. The Bureau of Business and Economic Research is part of the School of Business Administration. This bureau publishes the Business Inquiry, and also began publishing a monthly statistical bulletin this year. The bureau offers opportunities for students to participate in research and active management analysis.

Education

In 1898, a small teachers' college opened its doors to 91 students in San Diego. Today that teachers' college is known as San Diego State College and has a student body of 19,000. Within the now diversified curricula of the college is the School of Education.


The School of Education has taken an active role in providing the community with an insight into the problems and needs of today's educators and their pupils. The school provides almost 500 student teachers to the greater San Diego area within an academic year.


The School of Education has also taken an active part in such programs as the National Teacher Corps, the Compensatory Education Project and the Peace Corps program for the training of teachers. Many education students have become leaders in Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and community recreation programs.

Health, Physical Education, and Recreation

"Physical education, health educa-tion and recreation are meaningful only if their principles and techniques are applied to the betterment of society." These departments have embodied their ideals. Through intercollegiate sports, the Athletic Department has guided San Diego State to national recognition. Football, basketball, cross country, and swimming teams have dominated national and state sports ratings. The teams have aroused community interest and spirit as evidenced by crowds averaging 40,000 at football games in the new stadium. The same community spirit is evident in the Health Education and Recreation Departments. Community leaders, specialists and experts cooperate with the various health agencies to provide students with classroom background and a program of workshops and institutes which provide community insight. Recreation students provide leadership for clubs, agencies, schools and recreation departments from San Ysidro to Oceanside.




Life Sciences

The wide range of interest represented in the Division of Life Sciences is indicated by the names of its six departments: Biology, Botany, Microbiology, Nursing, Psychology and Zoology. The faculty brings to the students of the division experiences from most of the major universities in the country. Their interests in teaching and research, and participation in the larger academic and scientific community of San Diego provide innumerable opportunities for the students to broaden their academic horizons. Nursing students use the local hospitals for their training and experience; many biology and psychology students are involved in projects at the Naval Electronic Laboratory, the San Diego Zoo, Scripps Institute of Oceanography, the San Diego Natural History Museum and Western Behaviorial Sciences.










Physical Sciences

During the year the Division of Physical Sciences has continued its position as one of the largest and strongest divisions of the college. It includes the departments of Astronomy, Chemis-try, Geology, Industrial Arts, Mathemat-ics, Physical Science and Physics. The total enrollment in student units is about one-sixth of the entire college. In June of 1967 the Chemistry Department conferred the first earned Ph.D. degree ever granted by any of the California State Colleges. This joint doctoral program with the University of California at San Diego now has eight active graduate students enrolled. Another notable accomplishment was the completion of an offcampus astronomical observatory in the Laguna Mountains. Facilities include a dormitory and three domes which house telescopes of diameters from 16 to 24 inches. The Geology Department com-pleted a project this year which has won international acclaim. This has involved exploring and making geological maps of the northern half of Baja California.


The great diversity of career possibilities is luring many students into the Division of Social Sciences, making it the largest division in terms of student enrollment. The nearly 3,000 students in the division are enrolled in the departments of Anthropology, Economics, Geography, Journalism, Political Science and Sociology. These departments also provide a variety of services to the San Diego community, including a number of special institutes and bureaus. Among these are the Public Affairs Research Institute which conducts research on a nonprofit basis into community and governmental problems of a public and/or administrative nature; and the Institute of International Relations which provides a threeweek seminar in August, bringing many prominent international and national figures to San Diego. The Bureau of Social Research, the Economic Research Center, and the Institute of Labor Economics make additional services and programs available to San Diego State and the community







Fine Arts



The Division of Fine Arts has an influential role in broadening the cultural spectrum of the city in motion. The division includes the departments of Art, Music, Speech Arts and Home Economics. A stimulating program of concerts, lectures, theater productions, art exhibits and receptions are provided by the Fine Arts Division. This year the long awaited Dramatic Arts Building opened in December with the production of "Ondine." A new two-story Music Building is scheduled for construction this summer. The SDS choral groups have received praise for their annual performance of Handel's "Messiah" and other works such as Dr. David Ward-Steinman's "Song of Moses" with Gregory Peck. The College Art Gallery features student and faculty art and historical shows. Ground is to be broken this year for a new Art Building and Gallery.






School of Engineering






Graduate Division


Library



Health Services

A full time staff of doctors and nurses provide San Diego State students with medical care at the Student Health Services. Although all eligible students may elect to have care at the Student Health Services, this service is not meant to replace the family physician, but does work in conjunction with him. Eligible students may have X-ray, laboratory and physical therapy service performed on request of the private physician, even though they are not under the care of a Health Service physician. Follow-up care is also provided by the Health Services upon the request of the private physician. A pharmacy service began operation this year.







Coach of the year Don Coryell led the 1967 football team to its second straight NCAA college division championship. The Aztecs, who were 10-1 for the season, represented San Diego State in front of 280,000 paying fans, while millions watched them on T.V. Highlights of the season included a 16-8 victory over nationally ranked Tennessee State and a 27-6 victory over San Francisco State in the Camellia Bowl.

Aztecs Continue Win String


The City of San Diego proclaimed Sept. 15 as Don Coryell Night and Mayor Curran presented the Aztec coach with a plaque. That same evening the 1967 football team opened its bid for a second straight NCAA college division championship by beating Tennessee State 16-8. San Diego combined a strong defense with an offense that utilized all scoring opportunities. A record crowd of 49,296 watched the Men of Montezuma Mesa stretch their win streak to 17 straight games.


The Aztecs scored on a 41-yard Joe Turpen to Tom Nettles aerial, a six-yard sweep by Mac Dillingham, and a 28-yard field goal by Dick Wood. It was the defense, however, that was the key to victory as it repeatedly stopped the offensive efforts of the Tigers, a team which Coach Coryell called "the best I have faced here in seven years." The defense limited Tennessee to 59 yards rushing and set up scores by recovering three fumbles and intercepting a pass.



Anxious Don Coryell discusses blocking assignments with offensive center Curt Hansen.


Dick Wood's 28 yard field goal easily clears the line of scrimmage.







Long Beach dropped a 20-7 decision to the Aztecs in a game that was televised to the Los Angeles area. Scoring was confined to the first half with Joe Turpen, Lloyd Edwards and Haven Moses scoring for the No. 1 ranked team in the nation. The running game enabled San Diego to dominate the entire game, by gaining 289 yards. In the first quarter the Forty-Niners were on offense for only nine plays.

Fine running and blocking also enabled the Men of Montezuma to keep the ball out of the hands of L.A. State and to score in every period. San Diego won its first away game of the season 28-0. The defensive charges of Coach Sid Hall not only shut out the Diablos, but also limited them to a total offense of just 94 yards.








Montanans Fall And So Do Aztecs

Aztecs prove their No. 1 - once more





Football Pro gress Parallels Campus Expansion

San Diego State has been the nation's Number One small college football team for two consecutive seasons. In accomplishing this, mutual benefits and challenges affected the campus community and the football program. While individual team members and coaches have been recognition, the school itself has also received nation-wide attention. Many prospective, well qualified college students desire to further their education at a California school. Where do the applicants turn? They go to the institution best known to them. The publicity which San Diego State has received through football program, coupled with the academic rating and climate offers the searching student an opportunity to identify with our college. The entire school benefits from the matriculation of these students, while the football program is afforded the opportunity of attracting new talent.

A successful football program also has developed pride within the students already attending San Diego State. Football games permit the students and faculty alike to say "Who do we play this week "? or "Did you hear that we beat

San Francisco?" This allows not only the players and coaches but the entire school to justly say "We are Number 1."

Victories over Tennesse State, Weber State, Northern Illinois, Montana State and all the members of the CCAA proved the ranking or our team was no fluke, but a 25 game winning streak was broken when we lost to Utah State 31-25. Even the loss to one of the major college teams in the nation demostrated San Diego's proficiency. The desire was manifested in the support the campus and the San Digeo community at large gave the team. It was hoped that the advance could be achieved while continuing our traditional tie with the CCAA. However, the league refused to take meaningful action. And finally a change in policy became the straw that broke the camel's back; instead of splitting the gate receipts 90 per cent for the home team and 10 per cent for the visitors, as had been done in the past, the league decided that in the future receipts would be split 50-50. Thus our visiting league members would take home half the money from our 44,-000 spectators, while we would recieve half of the gate from their 9,000 fans who watch our games on the road. -President Malcolm Love announced our withdrawal from the CCAA and San Diego's football life entered its most critical period.

The Future

Quo Vadis? Failure to gain affiliation with a major conference, coupled with the Chargers' priority for scheduling dates in the new stadium make setting permanent dates a hazardous chore. The thirty-odd scholarships Coach Don Coryell has to utilize places the team at an obvious disadvantage when playing major foes, like Utah State with its 110 full scholarships. In addition, lack of funds presently prohibit the installation of a freshman football program. Thus most of our players are Junior College trans-

fers who are subject to the harassment of rules by members of the NCAA, who are mainly from areas where junior colleges are scarce, or not utilized. This year six Aztec starters were ruled ineligible for the Camellia Bowl.

These problems are not insurmountable. Coach Coryell has had a successful year recruiting, and the team's spring session has proved that next fall's team is probably the best yet, but our schedule is also the toughest in our history.

Excellence-The Key Word

All human things are subject to decay, if meaningful dedication and purpose are not present. With Mr. Coryell in charge we have no worries in this area. In addition to the dedication of our head coach and his staff the players also extend themselves. Not only must the athletes put in full day at school but they practice up to 30 hours per week in the fall and spring, and work 40 hours a month for their scholarships. Their enrollment enhances the stature of San Diego State. In fact the team is a physical manifestation of the desire of the campus community to achieve excellence in all areas. The attainment of this goal, and the wide recognition which it gives us, can only be achieved if we the students continue to increase the support of our athletic programs.

Seventeen players gained honors for their play this season, and of course the list was led by 6-3 flanker Haven Moses, who was named to a first team berth on the Sporting News and Time Magazine major college All-American team. Moses was also named to the honorable mention list on the Newspaper Enterprise Association (NEA) and United Press-International major college All-American teams.

Other honors won by Moses included first team Associated Press Little All-Coast, and first team All-California Collegiate Athletic Association.

Moses was also picked to play in the Shrine East-West Game, the Senior Bowl and the Hula Bowl. He declined the latter because of the conflict with Senior Bowl.

Others receiving Little All-American mention include middle guard Jim Hight, defensive back John Beck, offensive tackle Steve Duich and fullback Lloyd Edwards. Also awarded United Press major college All-Coast mention were Duich, Hight, Beck, center Curt Hansen, tailback Ted Washington, defensive end Cliff Hancock and defensive back Nate Wright.

Besides Moses, United Press Little All-Coast first team honors went to Duich. Hansen, Hancock, Beck, defensive end Larry Schakel, defensive tackle Dick Weber and defensive back Jim Crossley. Second team selections included tackle Dave Ogas, guard Dave Thornton, Edwards, Hight, and Wright while end Tom Nettles, Washington, Hancock and linebacker Mike Meagher received honorable mention honors.

All-CCAA first team picks included Moses, Duich, guard Paul Daniels, Edwards, Hight, Hancock and Beck.

Six Aztecs were named to the annual North-South Potato Bowl Shrine Game to be played, December 23, at Bakersfield. They include Hansen, Washington, Hight, Hancock, and Beck.

In the Camellia Bowl quarterback Joe Turpen, was voted most valuable player for leading the Aztecs to victory.

Turpen completed 10 of 16 passes for 118 yards and carried the ball ten times for 74 yards.



Although winners of the CCAA crown for the second straight year, the Aztecs closed their season on a low note — losing to Irvine in the regional semi-finals.







Bob Clem, another Aztec standout, forces his man out of position before he drives in for the layup. Bob was awarded a berth on the CCAA second team.






Cross Country Captures Crown

Dedication and hard work produce NCAA crown




Senior Greg Bagby placed third in the NCAA finals, second in the CCAA championship race and was the team's outstanding runner.



Tough Schedule Slows Poloists



















Win Marine Tourney Twice




Standouts and Depth Win



IFC Sports Some Win But All Benefit






Blue Key


